I.

The name of this corporation is:

GLENDORA ROTARY CHARITIES, INC.

II.

The purposes for which this corporation is formed, the specific and primary purpose for which it is formed being set forth in subparagraph (a) of this Article II, are as follows:

(a) The specific activity in which the corporation is primarily to engage is the carrying on of activities from which funds are received and in turn the making of donations to, dispensing charitable contributions through, and otherwise aiding and supporting those organizations qualified for exemption from Federal income tax under the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 as now in effect or as subsequently amended, which are organized and operated exclusively for religious, charitable, scientific, literary or educational purposes, or for the prevention of cruelty to children or animals, no part of the net earnings of which inures to the benefit of any private shareholder or individual, no substantial part of the activities of which is carrying on propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and which do not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distributing of statements), any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

(b) To solicit, collect, receive, acquire, hold and invest money and property, both real and personal, received by gift, contribution, bequest, devise or otherwise; to sell and convert property, both real and personal, into cash; and to use the funds of this corporation for any of the purposes for which this corporation is formed.

(c) To purchase or otherwise acquire, own, hold, sell, assign, transfer, or otherwise dispose of, mortgage, pledge, or otherwise hypothecate or encumber, and to deal in and with shares, bonds, notes, debentures or other

1 securities or evidence of indebtedness of any person, firm, corporation or
2 association and, while the owner or holder thereof, to exercise all rights, powers
3 and privileges of ownership.

4 (d) To purchase or otherwise acquire, own, hold, use, sell, exchange,
5 assign, convey, lease or otherwise dispose of and mortgage or otherwise
6 hypothecate or encumber real and personal property.

7 (e) To borrow money, incur indebtedness and to secure the repayment
8 of the same by mortgage, pledge, deed of trust, or other hypothecation of
9 property, both real and personal.

10 (f) To carry into effect any one or more of the objects and purposes
11 hereinabove set forth and to that end to do any one or more of the acts and
12 things aforesaid, and likewise any and all acts or things necessary or incidental
13 thereto; and, in conducting or carrying on its activities, and for the purpose
14 of promoting or furthering any one or more of its said objects or purposes, to
15 exercise any or all of the powers hereinabove set forth in this Article, and
16 any other or additional power now or hereafter authorized by law, either alone
17 or in conjunction with others, as principal, agent or otherwise; provided,
18 however, that this corporation shall not have the power to, and shall not, carry
19 on propaganda, or otherwise attempt, to influence legislation or to participate
20 in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distributing of statements), any
21 political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

22 The foregoing statement of purposes shall be construed as a statement
23 of both purposes and powers, and the purposes and powers stated in each
24 clause, except where otherwise expressed, shall be in nowise limited or res-
25 tricted by reference to or inference from the terms or provisions of any other
26 clause, but shall be regarded as independent purposes and powers.

27 Notwithstanding any of the above statements of purposes and powers,
28 this corporation shall not engage in activities which in themselves are not in
29 furtherance of the charitable purposes set forth in subparagraph (a) of this
30 Article II.

31 The properties of this corporation shall be held in trust for the purposes
32 above set forth, but with full power to sell, exchange, encumber or otherwise

1 dispose of the same, subject to the rights of the creditors of this corporation.

2 III.

3 The county in the State of California where the principal office for the
4 transaction of the business of this corporation is to be located is Los Angeles
5 County.

6 IV.

7 The number of Directors of this corporation shall be eight (8), and the
8 names and addresses of the persons who are appointed to act in the capacity of
9 Directors until the selection of their successors are as follows:

19 The number of Directors may be fixed or changed from time to time by
20 amendment of the Articles of Incorporation, or by amendment of the By-Laws
21 of this corporation duly adopted by the vote or written assent of the members
22 of the corporation pursuant to the By-Laws.

24 The persons who are Directors of this corporation from time to time shall
25 be its only members and upon ceasing to be a Director of this corporation, any
26 such person shall cease to be a member.

27 The members and Directors of this corporation shall have no liability
28 for dues or assessments. In the election of Directors each member of this
29 corporation shall be entitled to one vote for each office to be filled.

30 VI.

31 This corporation is organized pursuant to the General Nonprofit Cor-
32 poration Law of the State of California. This corporation is not organized

1 not shall it be operated, for pecuniary gain or profit, and it does not con-
2 template the distribution of gains, profits or dividends to the members thereof
3 or to any private shareholder or individual. The property, assets, profits
4 and net income of this corporation are irrevocably dedicated to charitable,
5 scientific, literary, educational and religious purposes and no part of the
6 profits or net income of this corporation shall ever inure to the benefit of any
7 director, officer, or member thereof or to the benefit of any private share-
8 holder or individual. Upon the winding up of this corporation, the assets of
9 this corporation remaining after payment of, or provision for payment of, all
10 debts and liabilities of this corporation shall be distributed to a corporation
11 or corporations, fund or funds, or foundation or foundations, qualified for
12 exemption from Federal income tax under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal
13 Revenue Code of 1954 as now in effect or as subsequently amended.

14 VII.

15 The Articles of Incorporation of this corporation shall not be amended
16 except with the vote or written consent of a majority of its members.

17 IN WITNESS WHEREOF, for the purpose of forming this corporation as
18 a private nonprofit corporation for the purposes set forth in Article II hereof,
19 under and pursuant to the provisions of the General Nonprofit Corporation Law
20 of the State of California, we, the undersigned, constituting the incorporators
21 of this corporation, including the persons named hereinabove as its first
22 Directors, have executed these Articles of Incorporation this 22nd day of
23 April, 1966.

Re: Exemption from franchise tax

Gentlemen:

It is the opinion of this office, based upon the evidence presented, that you are exempt from State franchise tax under the provisions of Section 23701d of the Revenue and Taxation Code, as it is shown that you are organized and operated exclusively as a charitable organization.

Accordingly, you will not be required to file franchise tax returns unless you change the character of your organization, the purposes for which you were organized, or your method of operation. Any such changes should be reported immediately to this office in order that their effect upon your exempt status may be determined.


If in any year your gross income exceeds \$25,000, you are required to file an information return on Form 199 on or before the 15th day of the 5th month following the close of your fiscal year. These forms will be mailed to you if you provide us with your current postal address.

If you have income from an unrelated trade or business that is taxable under the provisions of Section 23731 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, you must file a return on Form 109 on or before the 15th day of the 3rd month following the close of your fiscal year. Copies of this form may be obtained from this office or any of its branches.

Contributions made to you are deductible by the donors in arriving at their taxable net income in the manner and to the extent provided by Sections 17214, 17215, 17216, and 24357 of the Revenue and Taxation Code.

If the organization is not yet incorporated or has not yet qualified to do business in California, this approval will expire unless incorporation or qualification is completed within 30 days.
